

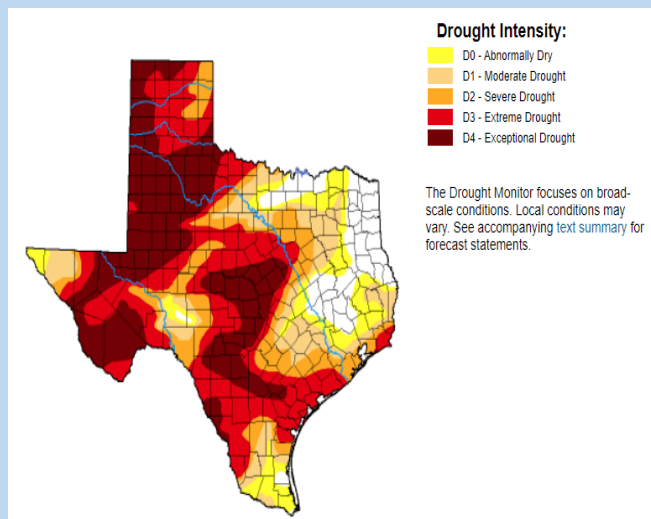
Water Conservation Newsletter



First Ten Days of May Among the Hottest On Record
According to LCRA's Bob Rose on the Weather

This has been one of the hottest starts to the month of May ever recorded! Forget spring, conditions so far this month have been more like the middle of summer. Not only have the days been quite hot, nighttime temperatures have been unusually warm thanks to the very humid air flowing north from the Gulf.

Looking at average temperatures from May 1st through May 10th, readings across the Hill Country have generally averaged between 8 and 10 degrees above normal! Across Central Texas and the middle Texas coast, readings have averaged between 6 and 8 degrees above normal, with a few spots more than 8 degrees above normal!



Water conservation has to be a team effort in order to be truly successful. For our customers here at WCID No. 17 that means understanding irrigation requirements. You may not be aware that:

From May 1- September 30:

Customers are limited to 2 days per week watering! Your day to water is based on your address ending number:

- ◆ Monday/Thursday: 0, 1, 2, 3 (Res)
- ◆ Tuesday/Friday: 4, 5, 6 (Res) and Commercial/HOA's
- ◆ Wednesday/Saturday: 7, 8, 9 (Res)
- ◆ Sunday: No automated systems allowed
- ◆ Hose End Sprinklers May Be Used Any Day!

FOR ALL CUSTOMERS: NO IRRIGATION IS ALLOWED BETWEEN 10:00 a.m. – 7:00 p.m.
